

Kevin R. Hennessy

Kevin Hennessy is the Director of Federal, State & Local Affairs in New England for Dominion Resources, Inc. He handles all manners of legislative and regulatory matters. Additionally he has worked on multiple asset divestiture and acquisition projects. Hennessy is also responsible for overseeing the Dominion Foundation's Community Investment Board for the Northeast.

Dominion is one of the nation's largest producers and transporters of energy, with a portfolio of approximately 23,500 megawatts of generation, 11,000 miles of natural gas transmission, gathering and storage pipeline and 6,400 miles of electric transmission lines. Dominion operates the nation's largest natural gas storage system with 947 billion cubic feet of storage capacity and serves over 2 million retail energy customers in 15 states.

Prior to joining Dominion, Hennessy was assistant counsel for the Connecticut Business & Industry Association (CBIA). There, he was responsible for energy policy. Hennessy has also worked at Connecticut and New York area law firms.

He is the past chair of the Rhode Island Good Neighbor Energy Fund and also serves on the boards of directors for the Northeast Energy & Commerce Association (NECA) and the New England Council (NEC). He also serves on the board of trustees of Mitchell College in New London, CT and on the board of directors for the Connecticut Coalition Against Domestic Violence and on the board of trustees of the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Scholarship Trust Fund. He is a incorporator of Lawrence & Memorial Hospital and serves on the board of overseers for the Bushnell Center for Performing Arts.

Previously Hennessy served on the boards of directors for the Connecticut Energy Advisory Board (CEAB), the Connecticut Energy Efficiency Fund (CEEF), the Connecticut Clean Energy Fund (CCEF) and the Connecticut Power & Energy Society (CPES). He was also appointed to Governor Malloy's Transition Team's Energy Policy Working Group, Governor Rell's Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Council, Speaker Donovan's Electricity Rate Relief Working Group and the coordinating committee of ISO-NE's Consumer Liaison Group.

He earned his J.D. degree from Western New England College School of Law in Springfield, MA, and a B.A. degree in political science from Holy Cross in Worcester, MA. He resides in West Hartford, CT with his wife, Elizabeth, and their three young children.
