

Robert R. Kulikowski, Ph.D.

Robert R. Kulikowski currently is the Senior Director of Environmental Planning at LanganEngineering and Environmental Services, Inc. where he leads the practice dedicated to helping clients navigate New York City's environmental review and land use processes, a practice complimentary to the firm's environmental, site/civil, and geotechnical engineering disciplines. Prior to joining Langan, Dr. Kulikowski was the Director of the New York City Mayor's Office of Environmental Coordination where he oversaw the City's environmental review process, including preparation of CEQR documents for major economic development projects. Earlier in this position, he also served as co-chair of the Mayor's Task Force on Sustainability, the precursor to PlaNYC. From 2006 to 2010, Dr. Kulikowski served on the Board of Directors of the National Brownfield Association, the non-profit organization that promotes responsible brownfield redevelopment. He received a bachelor's degree from the University of Rochester and a doctorate in biology from the University at Albany. Following a post-doctoral fellowship at the University of Chicago, he worked as a research scientist for a number of years holding faculty appointments at several medical schools. Subsequently, he was the head of New York City's radiation protection program and also worked as a consultant to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission.
